Criteria:

- ❖ Deadline to apply is **January 3, 2023**.
- ❖ Tour dates are **June 17-23, 2023**.
- ❖ Student must be a rising high school junior or senior, or 2023 graduate.
- ❖ Students must reside in a residence receiving electric service from CCEC.
- ❖ Transportation to Raleigh must be provided the day before the tour to Washington, D.C.
- ❖ Youth Tourists are **required** to travel to and from Washington D.C. with the NCEMC Youth Tour group.
- ❖ Children and grandchildren of CCEC employees are not eligible to apply.
