82nd ANNUAL MEETING OF THE MEMBERS • MAY 5, 2022

Carteret-Craven Electric Cooperative (CCEC) hosted its 82nd annual meeting of the membership virtually on May 5, 2022.

CEO Jake Joplin and CCEC Board President Ben Ball shared highlights of 2021, as well as an overview of the co-op's current activities and future plans.

The meeting also included videos highlighting two programs funded by Operation RoundUP, CCEC's Bright Idea's Education Grant program and CCEC's High School Scholarship program.
